History Created

It was at a time when the struggle for social and educational advancement of women was gaining momentum in the country that a number of women leaders like Mrs. Sarojini Naidu, Rajkumari Amrit Kaur, Rani Laxmibai Rajwade, Mrs. Rustom Fardoonji, Dr. Muthulaxmi Reddy, Smt. Kamaladevi Chatteropadhyay, Mrs. Margaret Cousins and many others championed the cause of their less fortunate sisters. They struggled hard through the forum of the All India Women's Conference, a premier women's organisation in India, to give a concrete expression to this awakening of women by remodelling women's education and removing certain social disabilities which prevented the progress. The result of their struggle and final success in reorienting women's education was establishment of 'Central College' which would comprise of research and experimentation to focus understanding of social problems for a clear vision of development for future of the country.

It Happened in Delhi

With nine decades of its evolution, Lady Irwin College has actively been shaping Home Science curricula to include contemporary academic content, appropriate and innovative research and sound technological knowledge. The coll-

ege has had the privilege of being recognized as a Centre for Advanced Studies by the UGC. The college has been a template for over 700 colleges and schools offering the discipline of Home Science in India and neighbouring countries, providing guidance in the development of curricula, programmes and infrastructure.

College gets 'Motto' from Mahatma Gandhi

Lady Irwin College has pioneered women's education, investing scientific emphasis on home and community life and contribution to nation building. It is indeed a matter of pride that the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi through correspondence with Rajkumari Amrit Kaur blessed the college with the motto in hindi "Vidya hi Sewa". True to the motto, the educational endeavour is to inculcate a spirit of "knowledge to serve" through carefully planned classroom and outreach experiences. This spirit of service has percolated over the decades to put Home Science on the academic map of India. With facility of residence the college continues to attract students from across the country and overseas.

First Home Science College

The first Home Science college of India with a two year diploma course was established under the patronage of then Vicereine, Lady Dorothy Irwin. The college was inaugurated by H.E. the Countess of Willingdon in 1932, on the 11th day of the 11th month with 11 students from nine

different regions across the undivided India representing different religions and socio economic cross sections of the society. The college was housed in a rented building at 11 Barakhamba Road, New Delhi with a small hostel attached to it. In 1933, number of students rose

to 60 and college was shifted to a larger building on 1 Sikandra Road, New Delhi. In 1934 One-year teacher's training diploma was introduced along with one-year certificate course in Needle Work. In 1938, opening ceremony of the new college buildings on 16.5 acres

plot was performed by Lady Linlithgow, wife of then Governor general and Viceroy of India Victor Alexander John Hope, 2nd Marquess of Linlithgow. The buildings designed by the renowned architect Sir Walter George are now classified and protected as heritage sites.



Illustrious Visitors of Lady Irwin College

The college has had eminent visitors like Mahatma Gandhi, Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru, Dr Rajendra Prasad, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, Dr Zakir Hussain, Smt Indira Gandhi, Dr Helen Keller, HRH Queen Elizabeth II, Princess Beatrix of Holland, Dr Karan Singh, Smt. Shiela Dixit, Dr. Kiran Bedi and Prof Yashpal to name a few.

In the initial years college was privileged to have the inspiration and guidance of its illustrious founders. The All India Women's Education Fund Association helped college to lay strong foundation for women's education till the college was transferred to the University of Delhi in 1950. The B.Sc. Home Science degree was started on 14th August 1950, with grants from Central government. The degree course was affiliated to University of Delhi. In 1952, B.Ed. program was introduced and exchange program with Sarah Lawrence and Briarcliff College, USA also initiated in the same year. In 1955, Nursery school was inaugurated by Smt. Rajkumari Amrit Kaur and exchange program for faculty initiated with University of Tennessee, USA.


The hallmark of education at Lady Irwin College is experiential learning, innovative approaches, industrial placements and internships which enrich teaching at both UG and PG levels. Experiential learning in schools, hospitals and NGOs is also an integral part of the curriculum. Students are taught sustainable technologies with lead examples. The college set up solar panels in October 2020 to set an example.

In 2022, much awaited by all students and teachers, the college education came onto offline mode with regular theory and practical. The online seminars and international speakers continued with their interaction. The community work enriched lives of students. The Food Technology students were encouraged to do science based projects under DBT-Star Scheme. The college continued to work on Women Collectives in various parts of the country even during pandemic under ROSHNI projects of MoRD. The college also served as nodal hub for ODOP-One District One Product for State of Delhi, for Delhi Government.

The teachers worked toward implementation of NEP in 2021 and its admissions in 2022. The interdisciplinary subjects continued to provide strength and capacity. The students take electives of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Sociology, Psychology, English and elective Home Science papers. They take up skill based options to hone skill-sets that can ensure setting up of start-ups, digital enhancement and job market requirements. This is in sync with national policies in particular and national priorities at large. Large array of co-curricular activities enhance leadership, self-expression and organizational skills which contributes to their personality and has long term implications. Our philosophy of education emphasizes reaching out to even more marginalized groups. Our focus on research and extension is incomparable. The college was rated at A+ by NAAC in 2018 and held All India Rank among colleges at 16 by NIRF in 2022.

The College is committed to sustainable development and addresses most of the Sustainable Development Goals in small and large endeavours. Its engagement to issues of food security, prevention of malnutrition, education, solid waste & e-waste management, rural-peri-urban –urban dwellings, water ATMs, water and air quality management, human development, initiatives for disability, skill and artisans capacity building are very evident. Activities from our college are lauded from various quarters. The college has received several recognitions, awards on innovation and teaching practices.

Lady Irwin College Annual Report 2021-22

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The Background

The year 2022 marks the completion of 90 years of establishment of the Lady Irwin College. Lady Irwin College, the first Home Science college of India. The college was established in 1932 under the patronage of the then Vicerine, Lady Dorothy Irwin with the physical infrastructure of the college building designed by the famous architect Sir Walter George.

Lady Irwin College was founded in 1932, on the 11th day of the 11th month with 11 students from nine different regions across the country. As the first Home Science college of India established as was customary under the patronage of the then Vicerine, Lady Dorothy Irwin, the college is proud to have had illustrious founders including Annie Besant, Sarojini Naidu, Rajkumari Amrit Kaur, Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay, Sir Ganga Ram Kaula, Maharani Gwalior, Maharani Baroda and Margaret Cousins. The All India Women's Education Fund Association helped to lay strong foundation for women's education till the college was transferred to the University of Delhi. The buildings designed by the renowned architect Sir Walter George are now classified and protected as heritage sites.

Lady Irwin College has pioneered women's education, investing scientific emphasis on home and community life. It is indeed a matter of pride that the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi through correspondence with Rajkumari Amrit Kaur blessed the college with the motto "विद्या हि सेवा". True to the motto, the educational endeavour is to inculcate a spirit of "knowledge to serve" through carefully planned classroom and outreach experiences. This spirit of service has percolated over the decades to put Home Science on the academic map of India. With facility of residence the college continues to attract students from across the country and overseas.

Over more than nine decades of its evolution, Lady Irwin College has actively been shaping Home Science curricula to include contemporary academic content, appropriate and innovative research and sound technological knowledge. The college has had the privilege of being recognized as a Centre for Advanced Studies by the UGC. In the University of Delhi, Lady Irwin College has the distinction of being the first college with postgraduate and doctoral courses of study. The undergraduate programme was introduced in 1950, followed in 1952 by the first postgraduate programme, and a Bachelor's degree in Education. With passage of time, undergraduate programmes in Home Science included both Pass and Honours courses under the aegis of the Faculty of Science, University of Delhi. Subsequently, postgraduate programmes have been initiated in each of the specializations of Home Science. At present there are five areas of specialization: Food and Nutrition, Human Development and Childhood Studies, Fabric and Apparel Science, Development Communication and Extension, and Resource Management and Design Application. A post graduate diploma in Dietetics and Health Nutrition and two Bachelors' degrees in Education, B.Ed. (Teaching subject Home Science) and B.Ed. Special Education (MR) are also offered.

The undergraduate and postgraduate curricula are reviewed and revised at regular intervals to reflect the advancements in processes of generation and comprehension of knowledge. The undergraduate and post graduate curriculum offered at Lady Irwin College were revised to the choice based Credit System (CBCS) from semester mode in 2015, which was further modified to Learning Outcome based Curriculum Framework in 2019. The most recent revision has been done in 2022 to align the curriculum with NEP/ UGCG 2022 framework.

The college has been a template for over 700 colleges and schools offering the discipline of Home Science



in India and neighbouring countries, providing guidance in the development of curricula, programmes and infrastructure. Several important decisions of curriculum advancement, research activities and educational principles have been initiated by the college. Several faculty members continue to support this input by active engagement with the Boards of Studies of several universities in the country, SCERT, NCERT and CBSE. The faculty of the college actively participates in consultations to government and nongovernmental organizations, national and international, such as the UN, regarding policy and planning for higher education in general, and the specializations of Home Science in particular. College participates in many programmes of the ministries of Health, Education, Women & Child and Renewable Energy.

Many of our highly qualified faculty have received national and international recognition for their teaching, research and publications. They lead and participate in research projects by institutions such as the UGC, the ICSSR, and designated government departments, national and international agencies.

An especially accurate marker of the success of an academic institution is its alumnae. Graduates of Lady Irwin College occupy executive positions in organizations such as the NITI Aayog, UNICEF and World Bank. Many are in academia, including as deans of colleges, teachers and principals of schools. Numerous alumnae have been successful in the fields of art, fashion, literature and as entrepreneurs in a remarkable variety of businesses, in India and abroad. Significant to the college is the RAK Child Study Centre, a programme for young children and their families being successfully run by the college since 1955, exemplifying the transformative linkage between higher education and basic education.

The College is proud to have hosted eminent visitors including Mahatma Gandhi, Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, Lord Mountbatten, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Dr. Helen Keller, Queen Soraya, HRH Queen Elizabeth II, Ms. Eleanor Roosevelt, Princess Beatrix of Holland, Lady Halifax, Shri. Rajagopalachari, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan,

Dr. Zakir Hussain, Shri. R. Venkataraman, Smt. Indira Gandhi, Shri P. V. Narasimha Rao, Dr. Manmohan Singh, Smt. Sonia Gandhi, Dr. Karan Singh, Smt. Shiela Dixit, Dr. Kiran Bedi and Sh. Javed Akhtar.

The College is ideally situated in the cultural hub of Delhi. Art galleries, museums, exhibition grounds, theatre, music and dance facilities are accessible within a radius of a kilometre. It is well connected by the Metro. Recently, an additional building for post-graduate laboratories, ICT enabled lecture rooms and seminar facilities has been added. Laptops are issued to all students who feel the need to hone ICT skills and computer based learning. The new wing sustains the architectural and structured design of the heritage buildings.

Post Graduate Studies

In the year 2007, the college took a critical step forward in the academic programme by launching updated curricula with more current nomenclature at the Masters level in all areas of study. All the five PG curricula were again revised in 2019 with contemporary content in LOCF format. The faculty of the Department of Home Science engaged with experts in the field and alumnae to accomplish this task. With the approval of the University, courses with revised nomenclature and contemporary content are being taught in the current session with renewed enthusiasm and application for socially relevant study in each of the domains of Home Science.

Commitment to Community Work

The faculty and students have responsibly engaged with people and communities in diverse and difficult circumstances, fulfilling the role of the College in generating knowledge and enabling access to the public. This has enriched and expanded the quality of academic work across specializations. Students receive the benefits of knowledge from advanced research activities even in their undergraduate years. Correspondingly, post-graduate and doctoral students are also urged to remain sensitive to needs of community, and align

their studies with issues of the everyday lives of women, children, families, and social institutions, in the domains of health and nutrition, human development, community resources, classroom teaching or fabric sciences. The college holds a Rajkumari Amrit Kaur (RAK) Child Study Centre, which gives regular hands-on experiences to the students as well as provide early intervention to young children and their families. It is this concern for and close contact with people that has been the hallmark of the college.

Advances in Teaching

Faculty members continue to advance their understanding of research in India by participating in orientation and refresher courses as required by the University of Delhi. Through these courses, conferences and seminars, the faculty keep themselves updated with the latest advances in their respective fields. The college community is committed to higher education in Home Science through capacity building and empowerment of young women. In addition to developing core skills among the students, teachers, the college education also address issues of gender-equality, political participation, resource utilization, and ethics in research methods in each of the specializations. In this manner, the young women receive training for both professional and life skills.



Their experiences at college are arranged to facilitate self- development, as well as to develop them in to active, energetic members of their community. Issues of social responsibility are integral to every course.

The college pre-pandemic had a collaborative student exchange programme with the Michigan State University. Each year, students from both institutions travel, take courses and exchange ideas. This provides both the institutions and individuals with opportunities for healthy cross-cultural collaboration, academic exchange and cultural understanding. On both sides of the exchange, students return to their home country deeply enriched by the varied experiences that are arranged for them during their stay. Also, The Rural Youth Volunteers in India- HSU-LIC Twinning Programme (Supported by US Embassy in India) conceived in 2017 and executed in 2018, has created an opportunity for cultural exchange of young students selected through a rigorous procedure of selection conducted by Humboldt State University in Arcata, California (U.S.) and Lady Irwin faculty for their set of students.

In 2020, due to COVID-19 pandemic, the teaching advanced significantly through online platforms. Even the University exams were in OBE (Open Book Exam) format. All UG and PG teaching and research were ICT enabled. The exposure to international faculty continues on online platforms.

ALL INDIA WOMEN EDUCATION FUND ASSOCIATION (AIWEFA)

The All India Women's Education Fund Association (AIWEFA, estd. 1929) celebrated its 93 years of service to the community. AIWEFA is the founding trust body of the Lady Irwin College, New Delhi which was established in 1932. Promoting holistic and sustainable development, AIWEFA activities include education and training of women for family and childcare, environmental sustainability, health and nutrition, development of rural families through introduction of drudgery reducing equipment for agricultural management, women's skill development, women's political representation, and programmes to fight violence against women. Combining academic strength with sound implementation and training strategies, AIWEFA campaigns and mobilises through its field projects, seminars, workshops, publications and networking, to bring about a sustainable approach to human development and advancement of the weaker sections. In 1999, AIWEFA was granted the "NGO in Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations (ECOSOC)". In 2003, AIWEFA accepted the role of Regional Coordinator of the UN's Informal Regional Network of NGOs (NGO IRENE). The year 2021-22 was an eventful year with series of activities.

An annual Programme on AIWEFA calendar is the AIWEFA - Nina Sibal Memorial Award - a Citation and Rs. 8 lakhs are presented to an awardee-organisation working in the disabilities sector. The NSA XX awardee organization was, "Kiran Society", Madhopur, Varanasi, UP. "Kiran Society" was established in 1990, in recognition of their inclusive vision and in providing the socially disadvantaged and differently abled children, rehabilitation services, rights, entitlements, equal opportunities and dignity through a life-style approach in urban and rural areas of five States of India. The award money from next year would be raised to Rs. 10 Lakhs.

Since 2016 AIWEFA has made presentations at the sessions of the Commission on Status of Women at the UN headquarters, New York on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to achieve the 2030 agenda for development. "A World We Women Want" captured sound implementation strategies from Africa, Asia, and Asia Pacific and SAARC countries to achieve the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and on women's economic empowerment in India.

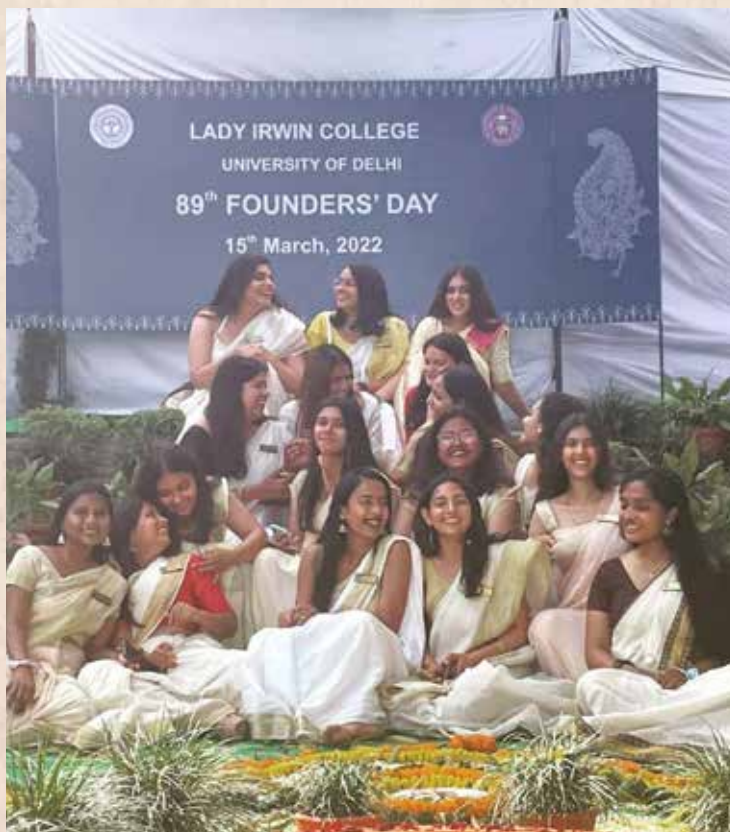
The UN's CSW66 event on virtual platform was hosted by AIWEFA in partnership with the Permanent Mission of India to the UN on March 21, 2022, titled, "A World We Women and Girls Want: Life Style For The Environment (LIFE)". The event featured eminent speakers— H. E. Ambassador T.S. Tirumurti, Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations, New York, who gave the Welcome Address. Ms. Smriti Zubin Irani, Hon'ble Minister of Women and Child Development Govt. of India and also Ms. Sima Sami Bahous, UN Under-Secretary-General and UN Women Executive Director gave keynote addresses. Special Addresses were delivered by H.E. Ms. Carolyn Rodrigues-Birkett, Ambassador, Permanent Representative



of Co-operative Republic of Guyana to the United Nations, New York, H. E. Ms. Rabab Fatima, Ambassador, Permanent Representative of Bangladesh to the United Nations, New York and H.E. Ms. Doma Tshering, Ambassador, Permanent Representative of the Kingdom of Bhutan to the United Nations, New York. The numbers of registrants/participants were approximately 550. A five-minute film titled, “A World We Women and Girls Want: Lifestyle for The Environment (LIFE)”, produced by AIWEFA and sponsored by Permanent Mission of India to the United Nation, New York, was screened at the above CSW66 event.

CARE is working with USAID and Gap Inc. as a partner of the ambitious Women + Water Alliance (W+W) to improve and sustain the health and well-being of 200,000 women, their households and communities touched by the apparel industry. As a follow up to this successful project by CARE India, AIWEFA is working towards preparing communities, and women micro-entrepreneurs for the implementation of the Livelihood programmes and activities in Madhya Pradesh. The project titled, “Research Analysis and Recommendations for the promotion of Women Entrepreneurships” is a pilot research project being undertaken in Indore and Dhar districts of Madhya Pradesh from June -November 2022.

National Webinar Series consisting of five webinars on Specific Learning Disabilities (SLD) were organised by AIWEFA. The number of participants who attended these webinars through YouTube and Facebook have exceeded over 2000. The eminent experts who addressed these webinars in a discussion mode were from all over India as well as from abroad. AIWEFA together with Lady Irwin College and All India Women’s Conference (AIWC) organised a Plantation Drive in the Asola Bird Sanctuary in the Aravali range with the relevant authorities in March- April 2022. Student members from Lady Irwin College, visited the site committedly twice a week for a month for about 3 hours/day and supported the plantation. The requisite training was provided by the Bombay Museum of Natural History (BMNH).

THE DEPARTMENTS



DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The one-year Bachelor of Education Programme initiated in the year 1952 and the B.Ed. (Special Education) in 2007, as a part of the Faculty of Education of the University of Delhi. *The year 2022 embarked the 70 years of the B.Ed. programme and 15 years of B.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability).* The B.Ed. Special Education programme is recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) and B.Ed. by NCTE, to strengthen the graduates and post-graduates professionally.

The focus includes various facets: training in teaching skills, mastery of classroom management techniques, competence to handle children with special needs, ability to establish warm interpersonal relationship within the class, development of communication skills, reflective thinking skill, training in various Home Science and Science related work experience, sensitization to community needs, skill in construction and appraisal of various evaluation devices, and development of teaching learning materials. The close interaction between students and teachers and the participatory nature of the programme enables the students to gain confidence and self-reliance, encouraging students to manage their own affairs in a democratic ethos. The B.Ed. programme is for two years duration, since 2015. The programme helps to strengthen the graduates and post-graduates professionally. A popular option for seven decades, the programme maintains the spirit of preparing competent teachers.

The students/interns of the course find an easy placement in various schools and other allied institutions. They may be

- Recruited as PGT Home Science, TGT Science and Home Science, activity teachers, special educators and primary teachers in various private and State-run schools.
- Teach vocational subjects such as meal planning and fashion studies etc.
- Work as counsellors in schools.



- Placed in institutions like Women's polytechnics, Nursery Teacher Training Institutions, DIETs, SCERT, NCERT, NIEPA and various NGO training and research organizations.
- Recruited as resource room teachers in schools and as special educators in institutions and schools.



Research Activities

Students of B.Ed. first year and second year were involved in action-oriented research work throughout the academic session 2020-2021 with their tutorial group supervisors and School Experience Programme -II supervisors, respectively. And submitted their final report to their respective tutorial and school experience programme -II supervisors.

Skill Enhancement Department Activities

Reflective teaching classroom practices (2021-2022)

This workshop is specifically designed for second year students who have learnt/given an exam in the Pedagogy of Science and Home Science courses in the first year and about to begin School Experience Programme (SEP) in the second year. This workshop enables them to reflect on their classroom experiences during SEP and appreciate reflective practices.

Home Science/ Science enrichment programme (2021-2022)

This programme focuses on the content of Home Science and Science which needs to be updated to enable the student teacher to teach “correct” content in the areas. This supports students understanding of current trends, life skills and planning, managing in execution of classroom activities efficiently.

Annual Conference 2021

DEPARTMENT OF FOOD & NUTRITION AND FOOD TECHNOLOGY

The Department endeavours to achieve excellence in teaching and research for outreach to community, industry and institutions to ensure promotive health for all.

The Department of Food and Nutrition was the first Postgraduate Department of Lady Irwin College. Presently the Postgraduate Department offers one year Post Graduate Diploma in Dietetics and Public Health Nutrition (PGDDPHN), two-year M.Sc. degree in Food and Nutrition and Doctoral Programme in Food and Nutrition under the Department of Home Science, University of Delhi. Furthermore, the Master's degree programme is offered in three areas of specialization namely, Clinical Nutrition, Public Health Nutrition and Food Science and Processing. Students find employment in hospitals, clinics, fitness centers, government and non-government organizations working in the development sector, the food industry, and academic and research institutes. Department of Food & Nutrition and Food Technology has been recognized as the State Level Technical Institution (SLTI) for Delhi Government under the Pradhan Mantri Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprise (PMFME) Flagship Scheme by the Ministry of Food

Processing Industries, GoI in 2020. We are also an empanelled training partner under the Food Safety Training and Certification (FoSTaC) initiative of FSSAI since 30th June 2017.

B.Sc. (Hons) Food Technology program was started in July 2017. A grant has been received from the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology under the Star College Scheme to strengthen Education and Training for the BSc (Hons) Food Technology Program in 2020.

Research Activities

The Department is actively engaged in research in the areas of Clinical Nutrition, Public Nutrition and Food Science. The research focus of the Department is on assessment of nutritional status, nutritional concerns, diet quality, food security, microbiological quality and safety of food products, situational analysis of programs/schemes for nutrition, management and prevention of diet related disorders, sports nutrition, development of behaviour change communication strategies/tools, development of new food products and other innovations in the field of food science. Several PhD scholars are registered under the supervision of Faculty of the Department.

Twenty-Seven Master's students were guided to take up independent research topics and they wrote a dissertation as part of their academic programme. They worked on diverse topics related to organic foods, diet diversity, eating behavior, relation of perceived stress with dietary habits/food choices, ayurveda and nutrition, plant-based meat analogues, infant and young child feeding practices, usage of artificial sweeteners, promotion of millets, biodegradable packaging.

B.Sc. Food Technology second- and third-year students also undertook research projects under the mentorship of faculty members. The key areas covered included green packaging, utilization of agro industrial waste, utilization of flowers for manufacture of food products such as rhododendron, edible films made from banana peels and walnut shells, processed food and beverage selection during COVID-19, antimicrobial resistance, mushroom cultivation.

DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN DEVELOPMENT AND CHILDHOOD STUDIES

Human development and Childhood Studies is a multidisciplinary department devoted to understanding the nature of human development across the life span in a culturally diverse, changing and complex world. The academic programme focuses on a contextual and systemic framework to the study of development and relationship processes through research, teaching, and application. The Department engages students in a curriculum that values and supports interdisciplinary perspectives and combines classroom learning with the field of opportunities. There is a particular emphasis on the study of heterogeneity among children and adults in varied settings.

Research Activities

The Department through its various activities has developed a multi-faceted understanding of the discipline of human development. It combines theory, practice and research and takes a multi-disciplinary approach in its activities. The research focus of the Department of Human Development and Childhood Studies is on addressing issues arising out of diversity in India. The Department initiates research on disability and gender while recognizing the influences different cultural contexts bring. Our Masters' students were guided to take up independent research and write a dissertation as part of their academic programme. Our students studied the impact of Covid-19 on a wide range of topics that affected children, families and communities. The attempt was to include participants and issues that influence the entire life-span. The areas of research included gender issues

such as gathering perception of men about women's work outside home, impact of the Maternity Benefit Amendment Act and sexual harassment that women face every day.

The students also studied the impact of Covid-19 pandemic on children's play and friendship. There were many studies that studied the



impact of Covid-19 on adolescent lives and how it influenced their sleep patterns, health, wellness, psychological wellbeing and caused stress amongst them. The students also conducted research on how Covid-19 impacted teachers, young adults, medical students, parents and elderly. Thus, a range of issues were studied on sample across the life span to obtain a post pandemic view. Our students also studied families with daughters in the farming communities in Kashmir and thus covered different geographical and cultural locales in our country. The students also studied diversity at workplace by interviewing people from LGBTQIA community and their employers.

Internship

Our Masters’ students did internship in five different organisations (details below) in which they learnt about the different programmes for children:

Some students worked in Legal Department where they had to document information about child labour and child abuse cases; some students worked in POCSO Department, some in Aid and Assistance Department and some students worked in Raid & Rescue Department to protect children from working in factories in hazardous conditions.
2. **National Human Rights Commission (NHRC)**-Students were assigned with a research project and familiarised and reviewed content relating to Human Rights.
3. **Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA)**-Students were familiarized with both in-country and inter-country adoption



process and to critically review the case study preparation formats.

4. **National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR)**-Students were allowed to see the files of the complaints and the cases received relating to health.

5. **Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights (DCPCR)**-They were placed in different units of the commission. They were placed in health & nutrition division, one in right to education section, one in DCPCR Journal and one in Missing Child Unit. They followed up with the Police

-officials/other agencies for Action Taken Report (ATR), drafted letters, reminders and notices to SHOs, CWCs, DDEs etc. Furthermore, they communicated with the respective associated authorities and concerned people.



Field Trips/ Extension Activities

Students visited various institutions and NGOs as a part of their Practical curriculum. They visited the *Parwarish* Institute of Parenting (May 12th, 2022); Magic Bus Foundation (May 26th, 2022); Society for Promotion of Youth and Masses for girls and boys (SPYM, May 19th & June 2nd, 2022); *Prabhaav* Foundation (June 9th, 2022) as a part of Development in Adolescence and Youth Practical.

Department's Outreach (Besides Curricular Activities)

Our students visited Raghurib Nagar to interact with the community. Students interviewed the local people about their lives, aspirations, facilities and government programs. These visits orient our students to work with the community and develop intervention programmes.

Other Important Events

Women's Day was celebrated in the HDCS department on 8th March '22 under the theme of the year "Gender Equality today for a sustainable Tomorrow". Various events were planned keeping the theme in mind where one could appreciate the women's movement and how gender equality evolved over time through a presentation to students and teachers likewise. Some of the faculty members also shared their personal stories on how they made themselves an equal voice in their households where patriarchy was dominating since ages. Some beautiful songs and thoughtfully composed poems added charm to the overall event.

The staff and students were in the colours of the theme- purple,



green and white and so was the beautiful rangoli. On the whole, the event made an indelible mark on the minds of our students since they all have to be the flag bearers of equality in society. The event ended with a pledge for standing up against any biases, discrimination and stereotypes while imagining a gender equal world.

DEPARTMENT OF FABRIC AND APPAREL SCIENCE

Fabric and Apparel Science is poised to be a leading department offering its students an ideal combination of professionalism for textiles & apparel industry as well as academic excellence. Department is constantly working towards the mission of delivering quality education and generating promising professionals by combining their creative ability.

The postgraduate programme in Textiles and Clothing was initiated in the academic year 1987- 88. It has evolved and developed over the past three decades, achieving high standards of academic excellence. The post graduate programme is suitably supported by requisite infrastructure, latest equipment, computer facilities and an extensive department library. The courses have been diversified and re-contextualized keeping pace with the latest developments in the textile and garment industry. The revised post graduate curriculum with a change in nomenclature to 'Fabric and Apparel Science' was introduced in 2007. The semester system came into effect from July 2011, by offering four semesters during post-graduation. The programme has been planned with the following objectives:



- To inculcate a close awareness of current trends, new developments and technological changes in the field of Fabric and Apparel Science.
- To foster appreciation of the traditions and heritage of textiles of the past and draw inspiration for the present.
- To provide depth, scope and professional competence through formal and non-formal education programs for continued professional growth.
- To equip individuals with the knowledge and skills necessary for creative, managerial and technical careers as well as entrepreneurship in the field of textiles and apparel industry.

The new curriculum is a unique blend of technology and design. The revision of the curriculum has also resulted in widening of horizons with the inclusion of new areas like Home Textiles, Textile Documentation & Conservation, Quality Assurance, Fashion Marketing and Merchandising, Business of Fashion, etc. The courses are suitably supported by hands-on experience through practical and research.



Field visits, seminars, workshops, projects and computer applications are integral to the course. The focus is on a strong industrial input with six weeks internship in various organizations such as spinning, weaving, processing, dyeing and printing units in textiles industry, garment industry, research institutes, textile testing organizations, textile museums and NGOs working for the upliftment of traditional textile crafts.

The post-graduate programme prepares students for career opportunities in the areas of design, technology, academics as well as research. The alumnae of the department are placed in various organizations as designers, merchandisers, production coordinators and managers, executives, entrepreneurs, faculty and researchers. Department enables the students to begin exploring their creativity by enhancing skills beyond the basic level to the level required to excel in the industry.

Research Activities

The Department of Fabric and Apparel Science is actively involved in conducting research activities in various allied fields like textile design and innovation, green technology for apparels, zero waste fashion, conservation and revival of traditional textile crafts, sustainable development and economic empowerment. The other significant areas of research include capacity building of artisans, women and person with disability, extraction of fibres and dyes from the waste, best buying practices, life cycle assessment, quality assurance, consumer awareness programmes, workplace safety and ethical issues, designing garments for people with special needs, development of sizing system for apparels, etc. Along with doctoral research scholars, the department also encourages and guides its post graduate students to undertake one year dissertation project as a part of their academic programme to gain a vision into the research process.

DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENT COMMUNICATION AND EXTENSION

The Department was established in the year 1964 as Rural Community Extension under the aegis of the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Government of India and was later taken over by the University of Delhi. The course was restructured, and the nomenclature Development Communication and Extension came into being in 2007. The department trains students in understanding behavior change communication and developing media and methodologies for the same. The curriculum is designed to build theoretical and conceptual understanding along with practical skills in participatory methods and techniques. Students are oriented to issues and techniques of advocacy as well as training in methodologies for capacity building and skill development of different stakeholder groups. One of the pillars of the department is its strong extension programme and over the years the department has evolved a multi-faceted experiential learning and holistic



training to the students to address the larger issues of different communities. Field experiences are provided to students in diverse ways which include- concurrent field work in urban and rural communities, month long placement in development organizations, Government departments and or corporate organizations. For undertaking its extension and concurrent activities the department collaborates with several agencies. Synergy of different organizations strengthens the community activities as well as provides a broad-based exposure to students to the agencies and issues involved in development.

DEPARTMENT OF RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AND DESIGN APPLICATION

The Department was established in the year 1964 as 'Rural Community Extension' under the aegis of the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Government of India. The nomenclature 'Community Resource Management and Extension' came into being in 1983. In 2007 the Department was renamed 'Resource Management and Design Application' after the comprehensive curriculum revision. The department focuses on management of various resources, i.e., human, material and natural. Management of these resources is integrated with design functions. The curriculum not only includes creating design for spaces, products and services but also analyzing and evaluating design with respect to human well-being, health, happiness and sustainable environment. The course offers specialization in the areas of Space & Product Design and Environment Management and Sustainable Development wherein industry specific core competencies



are developed. Students are provided academic inputs through the course curriculum as well as through experiential learning in relevant area to enrich the theoretical base. Dissertations, seminar, internship and placement are essential components of the programme.

Research Activities

The research focus of the Department is on product design and development, understanding spaces and human needs, environment conservation and sustainable development. The other important areas of research are indoor air quality, solid waste management, sustainable development, entrepreneurship, ergonomics and designing for special needs. Master's students are guided to take up independent research including primary and secondary data collection; they also write a dissertation as part of their academic programme. The Department strives to explore participatory methodologies and innovative techniques in research.

The Department of Science, Lady Irwin College has its roots in the origin of B.Sc. Home Science degree programme in the year 1950. The Department of Science has been engaging highly qualified faculty from various disciplines: Botany, Biomedical Sciences, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Horticulture, Molecular Biology, Physics, Zoology etc. Department of Science has interdisciplinary approach, it is committed towards instilling rational thinking, creating scientific temper and decision making amongst undergraduates through basic and applied teaching in the streams of Botany, Chemistry, Environmental sciences, Physics and Zoology. The curriculum of the subjects trains the students in laws of natural sciences through supportive practical experiments and field visits.

Our students hail from various educational backgrounds, many of them are not having sufficient preparatory training in sciences. This Coursework hence helps preparing a level playfield for all by the time they are ready to pass out and join their professional duties.

The curriculum of science also helps students in developing research skill in sciences to do research at Masters and Ph. D. level. Many students opt for B. Ed. and B. Ed. Special Education after finishing their under graduate programmes. Having a strong science base at undergraduate level, the students are able to efficiently teach science to school students after doing Bachelor of Education. The Science courses provide skill and build capacities in students to become leaders in their professional life.

The Department of Science prepares the students to have an analytical thinking, to be observant, to have a rationalistic approach, to value and conserve natural resources and to be sensitive towards agrarian society. The department makes the students aware about eco-friendly farming and organic food. The department organizes various academic activities viz. lectures, debate competitions, webinars, slogan writing and



photography competitions, plantations, conservation of environment activities, field visits, Eco Club activities, quizzes etc.

Research Activities of the Department

The Department of Science is committed to conduct research-based activities for the benefit of the students and academia as whole. The activities include, interdisciplinary research covering varied dimensions from all the core subjects like physics, chemistry, botany, zoology and environmental sciences. The faculty is guiding students working in different areas of research like studies of physicochemical properties of honey, vitamin C analysis etc. under the DBT star program. The other domains of research include studies on birds, urban ecosystems and food habitat sustainability, long-term population dynamics of water bird communities and climate change, macro fauna diversity in agricultural soil for sustainable production of food, availability of food commodities through urban agricultural practices and impact of polluted Yamuna water on the agricultural practices performed by the farming community. The faculty members have also worked on molecular docking and MD simulations of different drug molecules on viruses. They have been

involved in introducing students to scientific writing for research journals and encouraging them to write research papers.

COLLEGE FACILITIES & PROJECTS



LIBRARY

Lady Irwin College library supports all undergraduate and postgraduate programmes offered by the college by providing and facilitating the use of relevant material. It encourages students, faculty, and research scholars to pursue higher value of knowledge, creativity and wisdom and empowers its users to be connected with literature published and electronically available in the field of Home Science and allied areas through networks.

Mission

The mission of Lady Irwin College library is to provide:

- State-of-the-art library and information services conducive for academic enrichment as well as social and personal development of students, faculty and staff of the college.
- Providing resources both printed and electronic for the courses offered by the college.
- Providing strong database for academics and research in the field of Home Science and allied areas.
- Online cyber linkage with worldwide national and international networks, universities and research institutions.



Technology

The library is housed in a separate building constructed in 1958, which has one and a half storey structure. In 2009-10, the library building was renovated with latest ICT requirements, keeping the ambience of its heritage structure and making it energy efficient. Today, the Lady Irwin College Library is fully automated with all its subsystems and equipped with:

- 120 seating capacity
- Air-conditioned conference hall
- Fiber optic 24x7 connectivity
- Wi fi enabled building
- Internet work station with 30 computers
- One INTRANET server with 13 clients attached to it.
- Library is a member of DELNET and N-LIST which provides remote access to numerous e-resources.
- College library is under CCTV surveillance since 2010.

Activities

- During the year July 2021 - June 2022, a total of 183 documents (92 purchased books, 46 donated books and 45 dissertations) were added to the collection costing Rs. 2,18,657/-. A total of 62 journals costing Rs. 7,40,679/- were subscribed.
- For library maintenance and library automation, Rs. 1,00,377/- and Rs. 5,43,775/- were spent respectively.
- Various documents received from faculties and students were checked for plagiarism using the Urkund software.
- Remote access to Delhi University E-resources and N-List were provided to faculty and scholars/students.
- Journal articles were provided to faculties whenever any such request was received.
- To augment the professional development of library staff, various webinars were attended by them organized by DELNET, DULS and IQAC Lady Irwin College.
- Libsys software for library operation was shifted to cloud in June, 2022.
- A library online session on “**Plagiarism**” was conducted on 26th August 2021 via Microsoft Teams from 9:00 am – 10:30 am.
- A library orientation session was conducted on 14th September 2021 from 11:40 am – 12:40 pm via Microsoft Teams for M.Sc. students. Step-by-step guidance was provided to students on remote accessing the e-resources via N-List and Delhi University.



COMPUTER RESOURCE CENTRE

The Computer Resource Centre (CRC) acts as a nodal facility that installs and manages all of the centrally available networks, hardware and software resources of the college. The centre maintains two dedicated labs equipped with desktops, laptops & servers. CRC offers technical assistance through its well trained and dedicated staff.

CRC provides and maintains 24×7 interconnectivity in college through the IT Hub as a part of the Delhi University Network with a total of 25 access points. CRC offers both wired and Wi-Fi connections on campus. Access to fast internet and seamless connectivity to all computers is ensured through fiber optic cables.



All users are provided an official email ID and password to access communication from College and University. Students and faculty are regularly issued laptops for academic pursuits.

CRC assists college students, PhD scholars, teaching and non-teaching staff in transacting coursework, research and projects. It provides printing, scanning, projection and conferencing services. CRC supports college work related to admission, examination, report writing, data management, procurement & maintenance of IT equipment. The college website, EPABX telephone system, CCTV surveillance are all maintained by the CRC.



HOSTEL

‘A home away from home’ Lady Irwin College Hostel nests around 200 graduate and postgraduate students coming from different states of India and abroad.

Lady Irwin College Hostel housed in two building stands tall and majestic. Made of red bricks walls, the whole building narrates a historical story of some old legendary Hilla Faridoonji Rustamji, who fondly called it “LIC hostel” certainly makes a bold statement against the lush green landscapes.

The main hostel Hilla Faridoonji Hall was inaugurated in 1934 and PG Hostel was inaugurated by Mrs. Hilla Rustomji Faridoonji, President, All India Women’s Education Fund Association (AIWEFA) in 1954. The main UG hostel houses undergraduates and PG hostel



accommodate largely post-graduate students and Ph.D. scholars. The sprawling lush green lawns in front of the buildings add splendour to the architectural beauty of the red brick buildings. The eye-catching serpentine staircase and spacious galleries in front of rooms characterize the main hostel building. The interiors and layouts of the rooms in the two buildings are in harmony with nature and ensure sunlight and free circulation of air. The students are free to jog, walk the lush green campus. They avidly use the basketball court for jog, play, group activities and study sessions.

The hostel is Wi-Fi enabled and the rooms are fully air- conditioner all-purpose common room, ‘Travancore’- the television and entertainment room with LCD facility which plays the role of a party room during festivals and occasions and a study room during examinations. The hostel provides all the students a safe and comfortable environment and is a Zero Ragging and a No Smoking Zone.

Post pandemic in the year 2022, the college hostel was opened in a phase manner with 50% capacity due to the COVID protocol and guidelines from D.U. Currently there are 99 students as per attendance register for the month of May,22. (UG:89, PG:10) who are staying in the hostel and following all COVID protocols. From (Feb to March, 2022), temperature of the hostellers, was recorded and maintained in the register on daily basis.



The Hostel is managed by the Hostel Committee which is constituted by the Staff Council of the College and executed by the Warden in consultation with the college Director. The Hostel Committee comprises of the College Director, the teacher warden and two faculty members nominated by the Staff Council.

RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR CHILD STUDY CENTRE

The Rajkumari Amrit Kaur Child Study Centre has been an integral part of the Department of Human Development and Childhood Studies (HDCS), Lady Irwin College. In its symbiotic relationship with the department, it functions as a laboratory setting for students, while the department acts as a technical support to the Centre from time to time. Since its inception in 1955, it caters to the educational and developmental needs of children from birth to 12 years of age, including children with special needs. The Centre provides opportunities for hands-on experiences and exposure to a variety of activities through play-way method, making learning interesting and enjoyable at the same time. It is our constant effort to incorporate novel and age-appropriate activities for children to help them achieve their optimal potential and inculcate confidence, curiosity and a willingness to learn. There is an attempt to nurture the uniqueness of each child, and so, the classroom processes provide adequate and appropriate resources, guidance and support to them to learn at their own pace. Also, in line with the philosophy of inclusion, efforts are directed at mainstreaming of differently abled children, together with sensitization of the community towards their needs and rights. Learning is facilitated through



interaction with peers and Individual Education Plans to provide child-specific inputs, as per need. The centre also acts as a space for providing supervision to ECCE trainees from other educational institutions such as IGNOU and Mobile Crèches.

The Centre offers the following core programs:

1. Kilkari- The Toddler's Club (6months- 2 yrs)
2. Infant Care Centre/Crèche (6 months- 2 yrs)
3. Play Centre (2-3 yrs)
4. Nursery school (3-4 yrs)
5. Inclusive Education for Children with Special Needs (3- 8 yrs)
6. After School Care (2-12yrs)
7. SETU- Systematic Early Training Unit (Birth- 3 yrs)
8. Occupational and Speech therapy
9. Remedial Education classes for Children with Special Needs (3- 12 yrs)
10. Extended therapy sessions for Children with Special Needs after school hours.



The centre also acts as a space for providing supervision to ECCE trainees from other educational institutions such as IGNOU and Mobile Crèches. However, in the times of COVID-19, the regular programmes at RAKCSC had to be stopped in March 2020, and children's online classes were initiated from June 1, 2020 up until February, 20, 2022. RAKCSC reopened in offline mode for all programs on February 21, 2022. Ramnavmi (10th April) was celebrated with role play by children on the song « एक थे राजा राम ». A Cool Party was hosted on 31st May, 2022 with children's favourite fruits and ice cream. The morning programs and crèche and day care closed for the summer in June, 2022. The centre has seen a steady increase in the number of children enrolled and currently 55 children are enrolled across programs at the centre.

ROSHNI-CWCSA

ROSHNI – Centre of Women Collectives led Social Action, is set up to empower women collectives, and equip them to lead social action on food, nutrition, health, WASH (FNHW) and gender interventions. We seek to enable women to transform their own lives holistically, through health and social development. Housed at the Department of Development Communication and Extension at Lady Irwin College, New Delhi, the Centre serves as a technical and knowledge management support unit to DAY-NRLM. It works as a knowledge and capacity building hub for scaling-up DAY-NRLM's Dashasutra Strategy and its committed activities under the POSHAN Abhiyan 2018-2022.

- Development of resource materials package for interventions on Food, Nutrition, Health and WASH to be used by Women Collectives and their institutions to promote behaviour change, improve uptake of services and foster collective action for improving maternal, child and adolescent health and nutrition outcomes.

- Support to Evaluation Consortium of Swabhimaan programme (demonstration pilot by DAY-NRLM, MoRD and UNICEF)

A set of 10 e-tutorial videos for training gender transformative interventions developed.

CHERISH CANTEEN

The College canteen is aptly named Cherish Canteen with the motto ‘**Choose Healthy-Eat Right-Inspire Others-Stay Healthy**’. It is housed in the Students Centre and serves healthy and fresh food at reasonable rates to the staff members and students of the college. The canteen provides snacks, lunch and beverages during college hours. The canteen operations are duly monitored by the canteen committee members to ensure high standards of hygiene and cleanliness.

The Canteen has both indoor and outdoor seating capacity. Adjoining the canteen is a green space that offers a clean and student-friendly hang out zone to spend time with friends over coffee and refreshments.

The canteen is frequented by faculty members, staff and students. The canteen offers lush green surroundings through potted plants on the sill and tables, hanging plant baskets and the surrounding trees and hedges. Moreover, big dustbins are kept in the entire canteen area. The canteen staff is provided with uniforms which includes Cherish Canteen T-shirts, aprons and head gears. The diversity of food available here satisfies the appetite of faculty and students coming from diverse cultures and is also a hub for healthy debates and interactions of teaching and learning.

The canteen remained closed due to pandemic in 2021. The canteen was reopened on 2nd March 2022 as per guidelines from University of Delhi with old terms and conditions for interim period till fresh

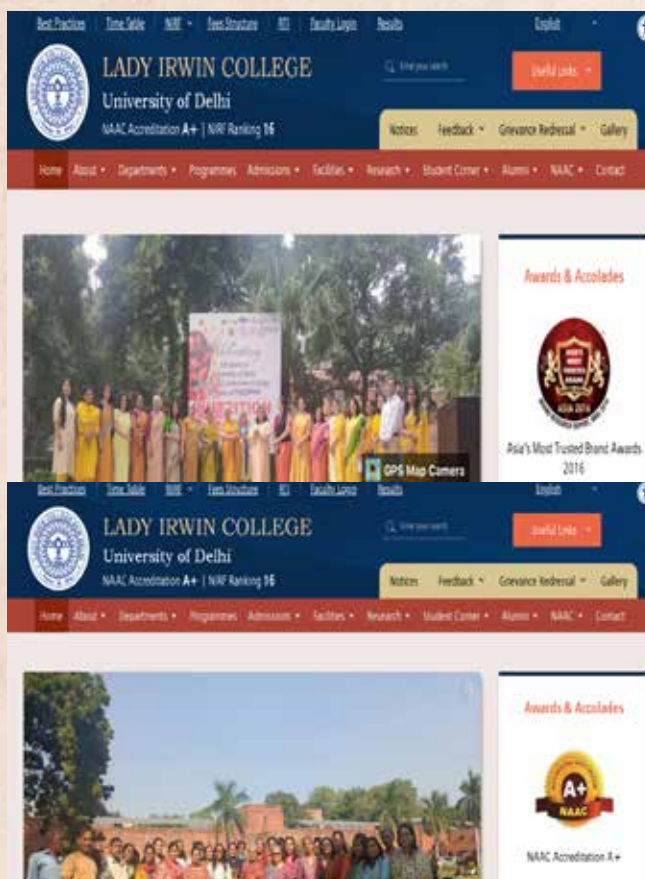


tender process is started. The canteen committee approved opening of canteen as per COVID guidelines and protocols from University of Delhi.

COLLEGE WEBSITE

During 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic scenario, the website has provided detailed information on the class transactions, course objectives, course outline and faculty involved in teaching various courses. Information about the Computer Resource Centre, Rajkumari Amrit Kaur Child Study Center, hostel, library, canteen and medical helpdesk, enables the students to utilize the facilities to the maximum.

Annual events of the various departments are also listed on the college website. In addition, the database of the various research conducted over the past ten years is also available for reference on the website. The alumnae section enables former students to register and be part of the Irwinite family (LICAA) and participate in college activities. The Student Zone highlights the admission criteria to undergraduate, postgraduate and Ph.D. programmes. The website also indicates about the various activities under student association. The website offers an interface between college students and society. The website also provides the interface for fee payment for various courses like UG, PG and PhD. Hostel Fee is also collected through the College website. For regular feedback, a web-based system has been created to take feedback from different stakeholders group namely, - Alumnae, Employers, Students and Faculty and reports of the same are available on the college website. The website is continuously updated and maintained by the faculty and Computer Resource Centre staff.

The internal members (6) were Dr. Priti Joshi (HDCS), Dr. Sangeeta Goomer (FN), Dr. Simmi Bhagat (FAS), Dr. Aparna Khanna (DCE), Dr. T.G. Rupa (RMDA) and Dr. Renu Malaviya (Education).

Dr. Peeyush Jain took over as Chairperson from Prof. I.S. Marwah and Dr. Ravinder Chadha as Member Secretary from Dr. Vinita Bhargava on 17th July, 2021 in an online meeting of the IEC. Dr. Peeyush Jain has been a Non-Institutional Expert Member of the IEC since its inception in the year 2008. Being conversant with the field of bioethics and ethical guidelines, he has contributed significantly to the functioning of the IEC and also in formulating and revising standard operating procedures for streamlining the process of ethical approval of research proposals over the years. Dr. Ravinder Chadha had been a representative of the Department of Food & Nutrition and Food Technology from 2016 to 2019.

The Institutional Ethics Committee had five meetings in the academic year between October, 2021 and February, 2022. All the meetings were held in the online mode due to the prevailing COVID pandemic situation. Dr. Peeyush Jain and all the expert members of the committee diligently reviewed the proposals of the five MSc departments and eight PhD students.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

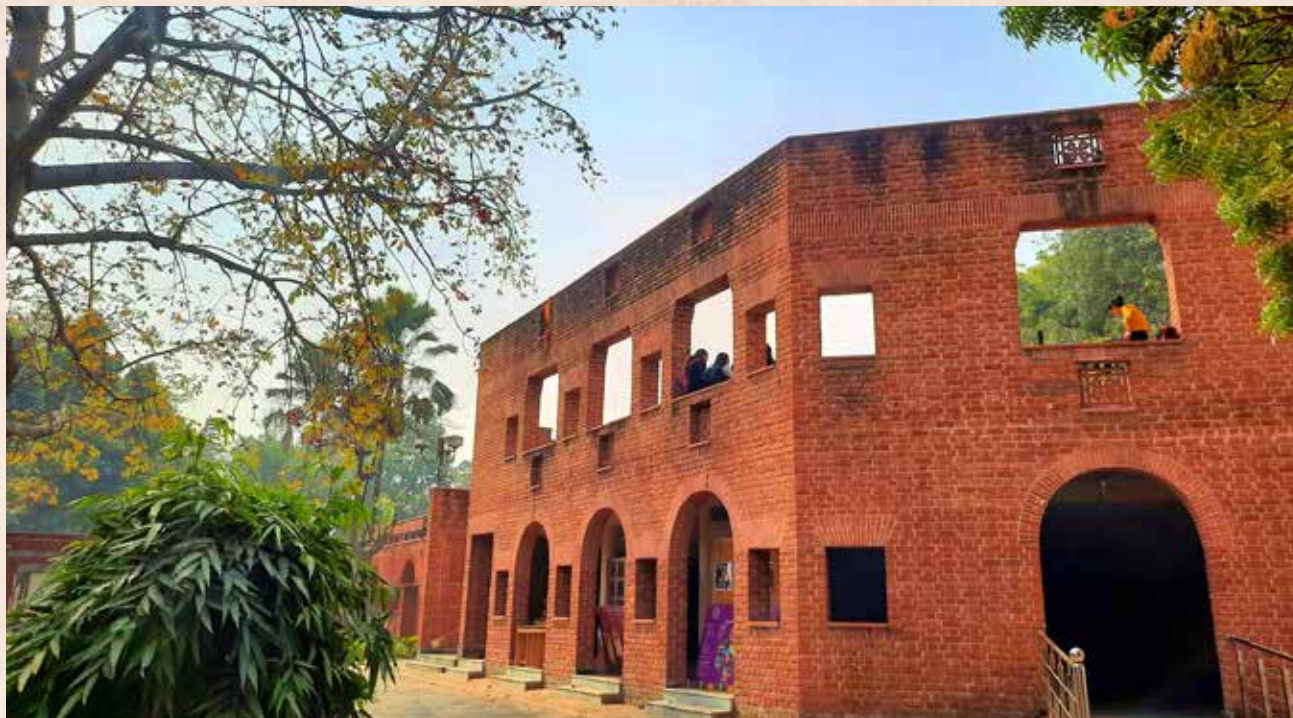
Equal Opportunity Cell of the College works towards making an inclusive and barrier free environment in the college and provides human assistance to all the students with special needs. The Institution provides the facility of the scribe to the students who require it.

This year EOC committee conducted various meetings time to time with students and teachers teaching students with disabilities virtually for identifying their problems in teaching-learning process and examinations etc. and did the follow-up accordingly.

As the committee take care of the implementation of legislative provisions and policies for students with disabilities during Admission and Examinations (Theory & Practicals). This year too all the circulars and notices from the University were circulated to the concerned students. Frequently their issues were taken and conveyed to the respective teachers to deal with accordingly. EOC committee continuously made extra efforts to provide a support system to all students with special needs required due to the pandemic situation. All faculty members were requested to provide reading material to the students while teaching via online as well.

Currently a total of 24 students with special needs are there. The teachers concerned with them were informed about their requirements in Practical examinations held. The responsibilities of scribes have been allotted to 6 laboratory staff members from different departments, CRC, Chemistry Lab and Physics Lab. Identification badges are being issued to all students and scribes as well.

This year 7 students with special needs got admitted in B.Sc. Pass Course, B.Sc. Food Technology, M.Sc. FAS and B.Ed. Special Education (MR). The committee has started working on development of educational resources for persons with visual impairment and other disabilities as well.

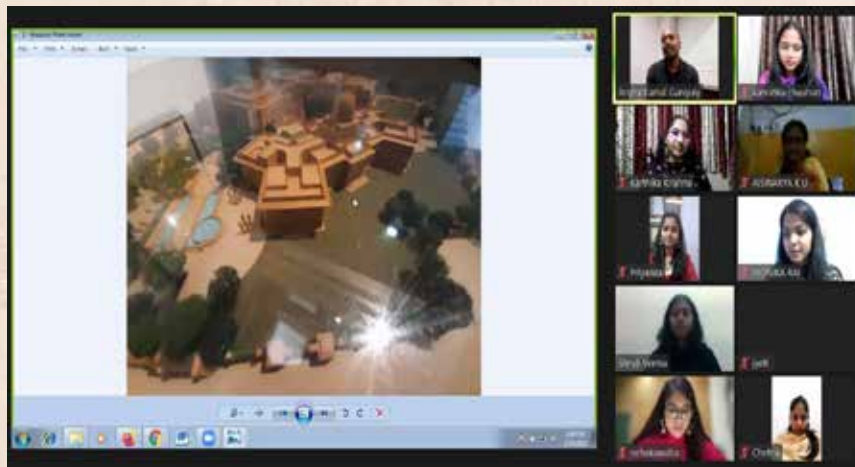
